Setting the context

- Participation in Internet governance discussion have been largely weighted toward North America and Europe
- Yet, of 3.3 billion Internet users, half from APAC. The next billion?
- Challenges in outreach to APAC: Diversity in language culture, geography, rich/poor divide
- Lack of awareness, interest, or imperative/resource to participate? Things are changing.

- Unique challenges faced <u>by</u> APAC community in terms of engagement and participation in Internet governance

 - Online meeting/discussion platforms
 - Discussion/meeting formats such as webinars, mailing lists, etc
